The sixty people who attended contributed enough money to house a mother and two children for three weeks in our shelter.

Do you ever wonder how your donated dollars are used? In the case of Steps to HOPE, donations stay right here in our area to aid the victims we serve. To house a victim and two children in our shelter for a twenty-four hour period typically costs about \$100. This provides the basics - a room and beds, utilities, etc. However, some services we provide are less obvious and include: 24/7 staffing for the Steps to HOPE shelter and Crisis Hotline, a security system with the monitoring service, options counseling for victims with our Case Manager, transportation as needed, assistance with job searches, referrals for health care and mental health assistance, housing and job searches and much, much more.

Many times, the darkest hours of the night are when victims desperately need the ear of someone who understands what they are facing and can listen and support them. We

are here for that at any hour. So, plan some fun for your community friends and neighbors and help us to continue to provide services as we have for over 32 years. 

- **24-Hour Hotline** for crisis intervention and assistance.
- Shelter emergency safe shelter for victims of domestic violence or sexual assault.
- **Counseling** individual counseling with a licensed counselor.
- Hospital Transport staff will transport and assist.
- **Court Advocacy** trained volunteers accompany and support clients through the judicial process. Free legal aide may be provided by Pisgah Legal.
- Case Management vs. Crisis Intervention holistic support of clients.
- ASK—Adolescent Skill-building Karate Program character and skills building for adolescent girls and boys.
- Advocacy Center forensic interviewing of children and adults.
- **Child Safe Exchange** neutral, safe ground for parents to meet and exchange children for visitation .
- Support Groups and Education Programs facilitated by trained professionals.
- **Community Education & Public Awareness** presentations and workshops in schools, organizations, civic groups, and at community events.
- **Resource Library** videos, pamphlets and brochures are available.
- Rape Prevention/Victim Services outreach and education.
- Second Chance Thrift Store outreach to victims; gently used, quality merchandise.
